EASTERN ONTARIO CHAMPIONSHIP SUPREME 2007

The Eastern Ontario Championship Supreme series has been extremely successful. With points accumulated at the indoor Games in Winchester and Smiths Falls, at the Kingston Celfest, and the traditional outdoor Games at Spencerville, Maxville, Montreal and Almonte, the final results recognize those Ottawa Branch pipers, drummers and pipe bands who had the most overall success during the 2007 season at our local events. The top three finishers in each category are listed on the last page of this newsletter. Presentations of the first place plaques and 2nd/3rd place certificates, sponsored by the Scottish and Irish Store of Bells Corners, will be made at 6:00 pm on **Saturday 13 October** at the Walkley Officers' Mess, the night of our first knock-outs. Because of the early start, we'll put on some free pizza and "goodies". At 7:30 pm we'll continue with the.....

OPENING KNOCK-OUT CONTESTS..... Saturday 13 October 2007

As it continues to be a very popular event, we will again run the amateur knock-out contests this season. "A" Divisions will be for Grade 3 and above, the "B" Divisions will be for Grade 4 and below. The year will start with our traditional 4/4 March contest for the pipers (four parts, one or two tunes), and a 2/4 March contest for the drummers (four parts, one or two tunes). We again hope this year that we will have enough drummers participating to make an "A" and "B" split. Note: to encourage solo drummers, a "duty piper" will be available if the competitor brings the respective pipe music.

If you can't make it by 7:15, please contact any of the Ottawa Branch executive in advance to reserve a spot in the draw. 

THE SONS OF SCOTLAND - SCOTLAND TRIP 2007



The Sons of Scotland Pipe Band took its fifth trip to Scotland this past August to compete, perform, and enjoy the sights of Edinburgh and towns beyond. Good weather, great friends, and magnificent venues were in store for us.



We departed Ottawa for Scotland on Sunday 05 August just after the band competed at the Montreal Highland Games. Along with the band were a few guests, one terrific highland dancer, and new Pipe Sergeant Barry Donaldson from Glasgow. Mr. Donaldson, who also plays with House of Edgar Shotts and Dykehead, had spent a few days in Ottawa working with the Sons. On his return to Scotland he invited the band to a Shotts practice which they took in later that week. That evening was just tremendous; the venue could be described as slightly frightening, but the talent and results were inspirational with both Robert Mathieson and Jim Kilpatrick very kind and welcoming to us all. The band also took in the Drumming for Drinks contest at the Lord Todd, and hosting their members from Scotland known as the 'Glasgow Division' for an evening practice and fish & chip night in Edinburgh.

The first show the band did was at Drummond Castle near Perth in honour of the 75th anniversary of BLESMA, a UK veterans charity. The Pipe Major and her brother played a tune written in the charity's honour. After that, the band stopped in Dunblane to play at the Cathedral to pay their respects to the children who died in 1996. It was a very moving experience.

The next day was the Worlds, and the skies in Glasgow opened up to welcome us to the big contest. We played at 9:48 in the morning, and did a great job. Looking forward to Perth the next day didn't work out, as the field was rained out. Instead we spent some time in the lovely town of Perth, and headed back to Edinburgh. Some of the band took time to dry out their kit, some did travel planning, and some explored Edinburgh further. But for a trio of us bold types, we went through to Glasgow and hit the Islay Bar, which was packed with pipers and drummers from all over the world. Lots of pints, and great music! It was quite the afternoon.

The next three days people had off to travel and visit, and many took in some great sites and came back with terrific stories! The next day some of us went to the College of Piping where we sat for exams, and that evening we were guests of the Caledonian Brewery for a pies and pints night. It was then off to the Guildford Arms on West Register Street for a quick performance with our friend Shakey from the brewery - what a fantastic host! Friday was our last day in Edinburgh, and we were busy. We started on Waverley Bridge for a 9 am performance to wake up the commuters, then it was off for a quick breakfast before a tour and show at the Palace of HolyroodHouse. From there we headed back to the Lothian Bus Headquarters where we hopped on a double decker bus and toured Leith and the City Centre, entertaining people as we played on the top deck...fantastic! From there we headed up to Edinburgh Castle where after a tour we did a show in Hospital Square to great acclaim. It was off to the Jam House on Queen Street for dinner and a show for the Caledonian Brewery before the big pub crawl started...all dressed up as pirates, the Savages in our band (their real name) organized a wicked night out for the band complete with commemorative t-shirts, eye-patches, and pirate gear to end what was an incredible two week tour. Next year... London!!

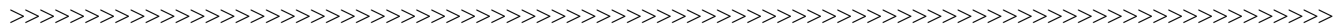

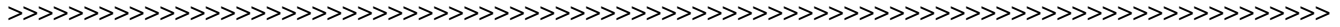

P/M Colin Clansey takes 2nd at Oban Silver Medal

Pipe Major Colin Clansey of the 2nd Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group (2 CMBG) Pipe Band, and the Glengarry Grade 2 Pipe Band, placed second at the 2007 Highland Society of London Silver Medal for Piobaireachd contest in Oban, Scotland on 22 August. Colin was edged out by James Beaumont of Bo'ness Scotland (in 2006 Colin came second in the Silver Medal to James' brother Callum). The Argyllshire Gathering in Oban is the first of two solo piping championships which have the privilege of presenting a Gold Medal for piobaireachd on behalf of the Highland Society of London, with the Northern Meeting in Inverness being the second of the two.



Andrew Hayes wins inaugural Kenneth Bush Invitational Piping Competition



In conjunction with this year's Veterans Memorial Highland Games, on Friday 15 June at the United Church in Spencerville Andrew Hayes won the first Kenneth Bush Memorial Invitational Piping Competition. Held in memory of Mr. Bush, who passed away 18 October 2006, this annual contest will honour someone who would be familiar to all those who have attended highland games all over Canada and the United States. Eric Ouelette finished in 2nd and Scott MacIntosh in 3rd place. The judge was Ed Bush.
